

Talent Management Program (DETEP)

The identification of people's talent and the realization of their full potential are key objectives in human resource management globally. Developed and emerging economies and societies strive to achieve these mainly through the school system and primarily with the involvement of universities. It is one of the central missions of our university as well to find talented students and help them improve their talent. This is not only a nice task and endeavor of the university but also its primary interest and something expected by society as well, thus it is increasingly present on all levels of education and in all scholarly programs.

Talent management, preparing students for an academic career, and training the future generations of scholars are all interconnected at the university.

The Talent Management Program of the University of Debrecen (DETEP), together with the city, has been an innovation center and stronghold of talent management in Hungary for decades. With its diverse academic programs and wide range of scholarly fields, our university is practically involved in the all the disciplines available in Hungarian higher education.

Who can participate?

- Those who are interested in research and scholarly affairs and would like to gain a deeper understanding of particular research areas than what is offered by required courses.
- According to the regulations of the program, all active full-time and part-time students who have not interrupted their studies for a period longer than two semesters and who have at least two completed semesters.

What is the goal of the program?

- to help unfold the talent inherent in students,
- to help admission into the master's and PhD programs,
- to help the most talented students in becoming university instructors/researchers and educate the new generation of scholars.

Advantages:

- research, work with a supervisor,
- scholarship,

- diploma supplement,
- an advantage when applying for grants.

What do students do in DETEP?

- Research work with the help of supervisors and based on an individual work plan. DETEP integrates scholarly students' circles, colleges for advanced studies, and self-study groups.
- Students have to register for the program in the Neptun administration system, sign up for a so called consultation credit offered by the supervisor. This has to be completed as a prerequisite for staying in the program.

How to become a member:

- with individual application: every September and February,
- the attention of those in the colleges for advanced studies is specifically called to this opportunity but admission is not automatic.
- Structure of the program:
- Research is carried out by students at the departments with the help of a supervisor.
- Department activities are coordinated by the faculty committees of DETEP, with the vice dean for educational affairs as a chair, the faculty coordinator (usually the head of the faculty's scholarly student circle), the representative of the college for advanced studies and that of the student union, and others invited by the faculty as members.
- The governing body of talent management is the Talent Council with the current Vice Rector for Scholarly Affairs as its chair.

Scholarship:

- At the beginning of each calendar year students can apply for DETEP scholarships.
- Those with outstanding scholarly accomplishments (performance) in the previous year can apply.
- Scholarships can be awarded only for such accomplishments and not for consultation or educational credits.
- How to apply? Visit detep.lib.unideb.hu
- Evaluation takes place on three levels: formal (Directorate of Academic Affairs), contents (faculty committees), and final approval (Talent Council).
- Uploads accepted in METISZ (online publication management system) are automatically converted into performance credits in Neptun.

Diploma supplement:

- Given to those graduating students who have completed the consultation credits during their enrollment in the DETEP program.
- Certificate + report on performance credits received for accomplishments and credits registered for.
- Can be an advantage when applying to the Master's or PhD programs.

Admission procedure

The Board of the School of Spiritual Science announces the admission procedure each semester, in the Neptun system, by circular, poster and possibly other media, and conducts it at least three weeks before the end of the academic term.

The purpose of the admission procedure is to enable the Admissions Committee to select from among the applicants those who are worthy of membership of the College and who meet the criteria to a large extent.

It will consider the student's professional and academic qualifications, interests and achievements during his or her time at university.

The admission procedure consists of an assessment of the application forms and an oral interview.

The Admissions Committee will assess the merit of the candidates according to an appropriate point system.

Students who wish to remain members of the College for the following year must submit a professional report to the Admissions Committee on their annual activities and achievements.

In order to maintain the College's diversity, the Admissions Committee will take into account the number of students from different disciplines and will endeavour to ensure that the number of students admitted from each discipline is proportionate.

The research and creative results of the student projects can be presented at institutional TDK conferences, where they are evaluated by a jury, which gives feedback on the work done and may award a place and make a proposal for presentation at the National Scientific Student Conference. The OTDK is held every two years, and since 2001 it has been organised in 16 disciplinary sections.

Student research groups provide students with the opportunity to learn and master the basics of research work in a given field. The TDK is a close research collaboration between the student and the chosen supervisor, with the supervisor acting as a mentor.

The organisational functioning of the TDK is managed at faculty level by the Scientific Students' Council and at institute level by the institute coordinators.

All students have the possibility to participate in a scientific student group. You can apply for admission by filling in a TDK application form (downloadable documents), which is already

signed by the chosen topic leader. Students may also participate in research workshops, if supported by the supervisor and the research leader.

You can apply for the TDK Conference with a research topic and a summary of your research.

The preparation of a TDK Paper is optional. However, if the referees assess it as appropriate, it can be accepted as a Thesis!

He/she will participate in scientific and scientific-promotional activities.

He/she may also carry out teaching activities.
